CLASS 1900 POSTAL DEVICE

On August 5, 1930, the USPOD authorized the NCR Corporation to produce taped meter stamps for use on Parcel Post Mail.

The Class 1900 Register was initially used at the home office in Dayton, Ohio on January 17, 1931.

Domestic and Foreign acceptance of these meter machines and stamps resulted in their use on all classes of mail.

In the 1960-1970 decade, corporate competition demonstrated that mechanical stamp production had entered The Electronic Era.

The NCR Company responded by authorizing a subsidiary, The Electronic Communications, Inc., Flushing, N.Y., to manufacture on trial "an electronic meter stamp device." The "Pilot Trial" stamps appeared on August 8, 1974 and were discontinued in late 1981.

Featured characteristics, rates, and usages of the stamps in North America and Foreign countries are displayed in the Exhibit.

#### HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The NCR Company was the first to produce a key-numbered, self-service, coin operated meter device to print and sell adhesives for application to a postal item by the purchaser.

In early 1971, one such machine was placed in the AUSTIN, TEXAS Post Office. It was contained in a cabinet five feet tall by two feet wide and was used a few months for Parcel Post needs.

A limited number of stamps are known, mint and used.

#### TERMINAL INDICIA MACHINES

The company manufactured the initial computerized omni-denominational Postage Accounting Systems and Stamps.

These devices were introduced on a trial basis, at the Flushing, NY (BAR TERRACE) Post Office, August 8, 1974. The "Pilot Program" was terminated in 1981.

Subsequent electronic circuitry produced the present day Integrated Retail Terminals (IRTs) and Postage Validation Imprinters (PVIs).

The following stamps represent the precursors of the IRT/PVI labels in use at modern Post Office window operations.

#### STAMP DESIGN

"U.S. EAGLE" placed at left.

"U.S. POSTAGE, TOWN NAME, STATE, AND ZIP CODE" are located at right.

NCR Meter, Number, Date, and Value placed at bottom of stamp.
